WHAT HAS BEEN GOING ON AT GOC



Hi everyone! Well it has been an interesting year...to say the least! Between spaces and places, coming and goings, and a lot of up in the air stuff...there has been a lot going on. I thought I would review what has been going on and what's on the horizon for the future.

First and foremost, we are staying where we always have been for at least a while longer, maybe as much as a year...but there are no guarantees. So we remain at 1717 NE 9th Street, Building A, Suite #140, **NO CHANGES!**

Secondly, we now have to pay rent, so with that we had to make some drastic changes in staffing. We receive \$75,000 a year from DCF, and with paying rent we could not keep both staff. Mike took the grenade for us all. He voluntarily took a layoff so that the club could stay in business.

I became the Interim Executive Director and Mike, is looking for other work. We also lost Jim Cook this year, and that was almost as big a

loss as Mike. I don't think too many of us realized how much he did here until he was gone.

GOC is actively involved in the Florida Clubhouse Coalition (FCC). Andy is the Treasurer and I am the President (how'd we get roped into that Andy?). We have to be at quarterly meetings held at various clubs in the state and have spent a week in Tallahassee trying to stop cuts. We weren't very successful, but the fight isn't over yet!

With me being the only staff anytime I have mandatory DCF meetings, or other required meetings (way more than I'd like by the way), I have to close the clubhouse. Sandy was helping by volunteering to run the club when I couldn't be here but now she is working part-time at Meridian and going to school. She's so busy now; we hardly ever get to see her.

So you think it's a one woman show...NOT! Members have been picking up the slack and without all of you, our doors would be closed! Members have worked together to plan activities, help people get jobs, make lunch, clean, help write and present for grants too! We still serve lunch daily, and the food is getting better

(is that because I'm not cooking hmm...maybe?).

The Board of Directors has been great as well. For example Markus Dietrich, who has been working with the marketing firm Trickey-Jennus to develop a marketing package for FREE! They have donated their time, work and the mailing list!

There is new stuff happening too. Members have gone back to school, a group of members is working on getting flowers in front of our building, and we are taking a trip to the beach. Of course we are looking for money EVERY day.

In the meantime, we will be closed at certain times so that we can take care of everything that we need to. I try to let everyone know as soon as possible; so check the calendar for updates to the schedule. We are still open 5 days/week but Tuesday and Thursday are meeting days, Food Bank trips, banking, contract meetings etc.

So please be patient, we aren't trying to confuse anyone. We are committed to staying open. Hang in there with me as we look for money and more staff., jobs and more members, fun and most of all RECOVERY!
