



GOC Growing!

GOC Growing!

At the GOC we're growing. We are a mental Health Clubhouse and we help people living with mental illness rejoin the community. The people we help are Members, not patients, or clients, and they join our Clubhouse for a place to belong. We follow a recovery through work model where staff and Members work side by side to accomplish the work of the Club. By participating in meaningful work-related volunteer activities, Members gain confidence, sharpen their job skills, and leave each day with a sense of accomplishment.



Work at the GOC is divided into Units. In our Office Unit, jobs include data entry, writing for the newsletter, billing our funding agency and more. Maintenance tasks, such as cleaning also fall under this unit. In our Culinary Unit, we focus on kitchen duties. We make a healthy lunch each day, and Members learn healthy cooking as well as food safety. We serve 15 -20 people daily. Along with making lunch and cleaning up, we are actually growing our own food. We maintain a garden at the GOC and at the Gainesville Peer Respite Center. We are growing tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, and various leafy vegetables.

There are 11 Mental Health Clubhouses in Florida, and 350 worldwide. People who partici-

pate in Clubhouses are less likely to need Crisis Stabilization, hospital visits, and interactions with Law Enforcement. We save the taxpayer money, while helping people living with mental illness lead meaningful and fulfilling lives.

This month we are expanding our facility! We have knocked down some walls and increased our space from 1600 square feet to 2300 square feet. We now have sepa-



rate rooms for our office unit, and a new area for eating. We added an All Purpose room for our activities such as technology classes.

We have also added new staff. Along with Executive Director Brett Buell, we have added 5 part time employees that share two full time positions. Having multiple people means we have a wide range of skills and interests that help us make connections with our Members.

On August 22, the GOC will be hosting an Open House from 5-to-7pm. We would like to see you here, and hope you can come see the great work we do. We will have a \$5 Taco Bar. Please RSVP on our website at www.goclubhouse.org and purchase your ticket. We look forward to seeing you!

Community Meetings at the GOC - CIT Officer Training



Despite the reconstruction going on at the GOC, we were very fortunate to host a few important guests that directly impact our community.

Every year, the Alachua County Crisis Center hosts a special Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training week for law enforcement officials. The GOC is one of the stops along their training route, and we were lucky to have them here on Monday, July 9th. Members and staff had the opportunity to share their experiences and help give trainees an idea of what is the best way to approach situations from their perspective. All ten trainees in attendance were able to gain insight from the stories and opinions shared.

The GOC also held our monthly Consumer Advisory Council Meeting on Friday, July 13th. A representative from Lutheran Health Systems of Florida (LSF) as well as a Peer-Specialist from Meridian visited to discuss the multitude of mental health services throughout Gainesville. Members were able to compare the services they receive and share what they enjoy about the GOC.
