New Look Website

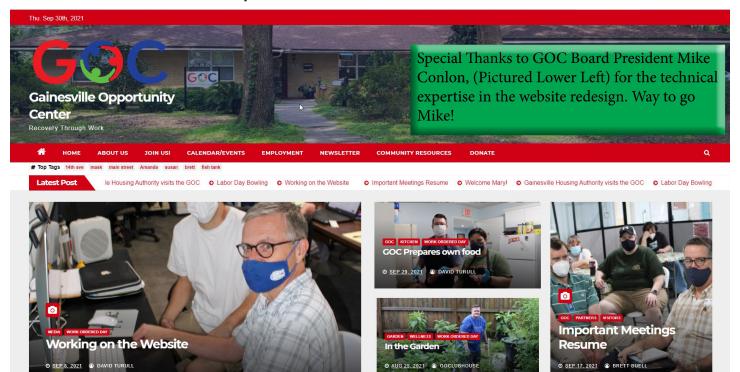

Meet LaSheka! LaSheka started coming to the GOC because she heard it was a good place to go to get a job and she meet people...both of which she did! At the GOC, LaSheka helps type the lunch menu for the week on the computer, sweeps the floors, and helps out in the kitchen. LaSheka keeps coming back to the GOC because "It is so amazing! It's a good place where (people living with mental illness) can come to get together, as one—because everyone needs help!"

The tasks that she does at the GOC have helped LaSheka learn how to interact with people better in a job environment. She uses these skills at her new job at the Alachua County Administration Building where she greets people and hands out masks. GOC staff trained her at this position, and even helped her navigate the city bus system so she can get to

work on her own.

LaSheka started coming to the GOC in 2016 when she lived in a neighboring county. After two

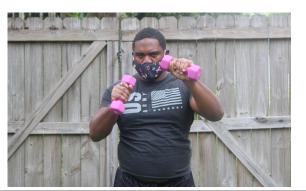
years, she lost her ride service due to Medicaid restrictions and was unable to attend. It was very sad to say goodbye to her when she left. Fortunately at the GOC, our program is without time limits. Once a Member, always a Member. This year, LaSheka moved into a group home in Gainesville and has been able to attend once again. LaSheka is now able to take the bus or ride in the new GOC vans.

Wellness

The GOC received \$24,241 from Alachua County for each of the next three years to focus on Members' Wellness. There are many factors to improving an individual's quality of life, and overall wellness is critical to mental health. This will allow us to continue and expand our activities in these areas. Culinary

We took an extra hard look at our meals this month, and we made them even healthier. We added "refrigerator oatmeal" to our breakfast menu. Making this from scratch involves several low cost ingredients and can be made without adding any sugar.

We have also been focusing on vegetarian options, and have been experimenting with meat-free Thursdays. Recipes include protein rich grains like quinoa, tabooli and cous cous.
