Where does the GOC fit in the Continuity of Care?







When a person experiences a mental health crisis in our area, our community partners are the first to respond. Grace Marketplace, the Alachua County Crisis Center, Alachua County Sheriffs, Gainesville Police Department, Helping Hands Clinic, and the City of Gainesville's Community Resource Paramedics are on the front lines each day serving people in acute crisis.

Law enforcement and mental health front line workers then refer persons in acute crisis to community partners that provide stabilization. HCA Florida North Florida Hospital, UF Health Psychiatric Hospital, and the CSU at Meridian provide short-term stabilization care to get people out of acute crisis.

Prevention and Personal Growth

For many who suffer from chronic, persistent mental illness, they repeat the process of crisis and stabilization many times. Without a community to surround them with the support they need, the cycle can last for years.

At the GOC, Members gain a social network they can rely on, stamina from the work they do here, and confidence because all of their work is essential to run the Clubhouse.



Our Standards in Motion

At the Gainesville Opportunity Center (GOC), we recently did something really special. Our Members—Jacob Warshofsky, Akeem Johnson, Kyana Williams, and Zach Scarton—worked with our Program Coordinator, Paul LeBlanc, to create two videos. These videos help explain some important fundamentals from Clubhouse International, which are like a Bill of Rights for our Members, making sure everyone feels safe, included, and important here at the GOC.

One of the standards we focused on is about working together. This standard is all about making sure everyone has a chance to contribute and feel like they're part of something bigger. The other standard is about reaching out to Members when they are isolated.

Members participated in each part of the process: directing, filming, acting, and post-production. Each of these tasks helps Members to build stamina and confidence.




